# "Oh Brother, What a Savior" Hebrews 2:10-18

Main Point: Chapter 1 emphasized the divinity & glory of God's Son while here in Chapter 2 the humanity & suffering of God's Son is highlighted. It is only in the God-Man that salvation was made 'perfect' and only Jesus being both fully God and fully Man can bring "many sons to glory" as our Savior.
