

Ten Values: GO!
(Mark 1:35-39)

I. Priority of Prayer (vs. 35)

1. Jesus began His day in prayer
2. Jesus often prayed in solitary places.

II. Propensity to Distraction (vs. 36-37)

III. Purpose in Going (vs. 38-39)

Main Point: We are all called to go and share the good news, bathed in prayer and unhindered by distractions.

- Is there any way in which your heart has grown cold or stagnate in relation to being amazed at your Savior's sacrifice on your behalf?
- What can you do this week to cultivate fresh affections for the Savior and renewed passion to go and share the good news of Jesus with others?
